FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Assurance of Salvation

“And this is the testimony: God has given us eternal life, and this life is in His Son. Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life.”

1 John 5:11f

When I was a young man in my late teens/early twenties, I was discipled by a leader in my home church named Bob Berger. As part of the discipleship program, we went through a workbook titled *Growing in Christ* published by Navigators. Navigators is an organization that encourages Bible memorization. The workbook is a thirteen-week course for new and growing Christians. Part of the expectation is that the student memorize one or two verses a week. The first chapter is titled, “Assurance of Salvation,” and the memorization passage is 1 John 5:11f. Take a moment to reread the passage quoted above.

The primary purpose of the church is to proclaim good news of salvation through Jesus Christ. We know we have eternal life when we believe and have received Jesus into our lives. When Peter affirmed his faith in Jesus as the Messiah and the Son of the Living God, Jesus blessed him and said that He would build His church on Peter’s confession. (Matthew 16:16ff)

We are moving into what we call “Holy Week.” The week we observe and celebrate the passion: Jesus’ triumphal entry into Jerusalem, the cleansing of the temple, the Last Supper, the betrayal, trial and crucifixion of Jesus, His death and burial. And of course, the week culminates in the most important day in human history: the resurrection of Jesus from the dead. For me, this week is truly holy and the most important observation of the church.

I want to encourage everyone reading this to reach out to family and friends to invite them to events here at First Pres. Maundy Thursday should prove to be a meaningful night where members and friends will express their deep love to Jesus Christ. Participants will include Jim & Sallie Matthews, Percy Quinn, Maggie Benjamin, Aaron Rice, and more. I’ve even hired a cellist for an original piece I wrote several years ago titled *from the Bride*. I guess one of the reasons I think these special services are so important is because of the number of people who became members of my previous church whose introduction to the church was a Maundy Thursday or a Good Friday service. Let’s make that happen here at First Pres!

Over the past several years, we’ve stuck to the same Good Friday script. This year we’re trying something different. Aaron has prepared the choir to perform a kind of cantata based on the Last Words of Jesus from the cross. This service serves as the culmination of our Lenten series.

On Resurrection Sunday (Easter), Niki will be leading the sunrise service at 6:00 a.m. This is always a sacred time for those who participate. And then, at 10:00 a.m. we will have our Resurrection worship service. There will be special music. We’ll welcome new members from our Youth Confirmation Class. I’ll be preaching on the final last words of Jesus from the cross according to John. When Jesus said, “It is finished,” what is the “it” He is referring to? Interestingly, there are several theories on what the “it” is. I’ll be discussing this question in my Resurrection message and then focusing on the importance of the assurance of salvation. As usual, there will be some humorous moments.

Because many lead pastors take the week after Easter off, the Sunday after Easter is often called Associate Pastor Sunday or Youth Pastor Sunday. True to form, Pastor Niki will be preaching on April 12th, but we're calling that day "Mission Sunday." Niki's message will be about Christ's commission to missions, and we – as a church family – will be commissioning our Mexico mission team that will be leaving later that same week. It should be a great Sunday.

For anyone who wishes to build a strong foundation of faith, I strongly encourage you to devote several months to going through the workbook, *Growing in Christ*. It may feel a bit remedial to some, but I think it's a great way to strengthen your faith. For others, it may promote new understandings of the basics of the Christian faith. Either way, it's an excellent course and I recommend it. In fact, I encourage some of our seasoned saints to go through it with some of our friends who are newer in the faith. This is what it means to disciple one another. I pray that we might know Jesus and make Him known, love God and glorify Him, and be filled with the Holy Spirit so that we might love others as Christ loves us and magnify God's presence in the world during this season.

This is the first of several monthly articles to get to know the missionaries we support in a deeper way. This month's Highlight is InterVarsity!

InterVarsity is a nationwide college ministry; we support the San Fernando Valley Section. They serve students and faculty of CSUN and Pierce College campuses with Bible studies, prayer, conferences, and social events to introduce students to Jesus, and mentor them in leadership capacities on campus.

InterVarsity wants you to know about a conference they held called Urbana in December 2025 in Phoenix, Arizona. 7,000 attendees came to worship, pray and learn how the Lord is working in the world.

- 800 students made either a first-time decision to follow Jesus or rededicated their life to Him.

Others made commitments to serve their campuses or in other parts of the world.

"There is something about 7,000 young people worshipping God all together that was so very, very powerful that I meant the words I was singing like I never had before", Ethan(attendee) Ethan is now serving as a Bible Study leader on campus.

Community Concerns

Have You Ever Wondered How Donated Hunger Bank Funds Are Used?

On Sunday, April 19, we will once again be collecting coins, currency, checks payable to FPCGH with a notation for Hunger Banks, and donations through the QR button on the church's giving page at FPCGH.org. We purchase and prepare food for three organizations on a monthly basis and holiday dinners for some organizations at Thanksgiving and/or Christmas time. One Thursday each month, our ministry members prepare special desserts for mothers and their children at the San Fernando Valley Rescue Mission and men at a nearby rescue program to bring a bit of joy into their life as they are trained in the life skills needed to move on to a self-sustaining life. One Wednesday each month, we prepare 65-70 boxed meals that are distributed through North Valley Caring Services to homeless people in our nearby community. One Monday each month, we prepare approximately 100 pb&j sandwich meal bags that also contain chips, granola bars, fruit, water, and a cookie. These bags are distributed through Los Angeles Family Housing to homeless individuals. As funding permits, during the winter holidays each year we connect with local agencies to help purchase holiday meals for homeless individuals.

We count on your support to make donations possible. We feel these community connections help us demonstrate Christ's love in a tangible way to food insecure individuals. 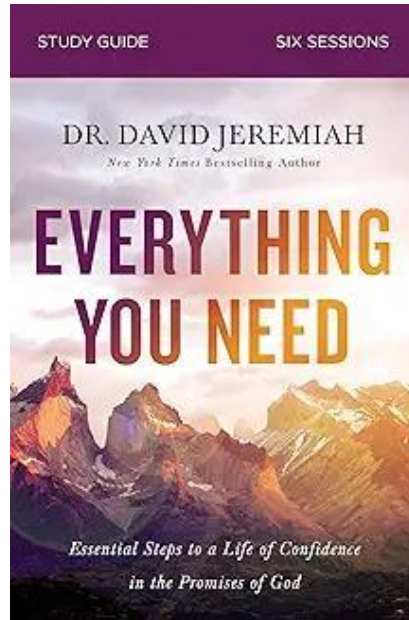
Senior Singles
