FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

God Is Doing New Things

*"I am about to do a new thing [says the LORD]; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?
I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert."*

Isaiah 43:19

God is doing a new thing. Do you get that? He's causing the dry places to flourish! This is the message of the prophet Isaiah to the people of Israel. And it's God's message to every generation to follow, to every one of us. The great question in the verse above is, "Do you not perceive it?" God is asking us if we recognize His actions in the world. Do we see all that He is doing? For me, this verse is not limited to one thing or to one time. Our God is a God of the new. And we should look for and follow the newness of God. Perhaps that's why we celebrate new years, new months, new weeks, even new days. Every new day we experience God's mercies afresh (Lamentations 3:22f). And every Sunday we begin a new week by gathering together to worship and praise our God. This new year, we begin something new. Well, not *really* new, because at some point, the church voted to do something new by moving from one service to two. But at this time we're moving from two services to one. Moving to one service will help us know each other better. It will generate more energy with more people in the sanctuary. It will ease the burden on our volunteers. It will lessen the time for our families with youth to be on campus. It will make it easier to attend special events after worship. And we won't be bouncing back and forth between two services one week and one service the next.

- 9:40 "Worship Prelude" (Contemporary Worship) in the sanctuary
- 9:55 Organ Prelude
- 10:00 Worship Service
 - 10:10 Children's Sunday School
- 11:15 Donuts & Coffee on the Patio
- 11:30 Optional Sunday School Hour
 - Kids Choir, Youth Group, Adult Small Group Bible Studies
- 12:00 Supplemental Children's time

*these changes are all subject to shifts and tweaks as we see how things go

I'm very excited about several aspects of these changes. First, I enjoy contemporary worship. It helps me focus on our Lord. And the idea of having a time of worship as a kind of prelude to our more formal worship service will be a great way for me to focus my heart and mind on Jesus. This time is 20 minutes before the traditional worship service begins. For those of you who like this idea, please join us at 9:40, as we lift our voices in praise.

Now, don't get me wrong. I also love hymns, as well as classical music. In fact, we have some exciting news for all the other hymn lovers out there. We should be able to share that news in mid-January. I'm also excited about the possibilities we have with our children. My dream is to have a strong music program available for the children here in our church family and in our community. I was a youth choir director for several years. My former students *still* thank me for those programs. They *still* sing the songs, many of which are Bible verses set to music.

I recently spoke to some of the young adults at my former church and I asked their favorite memories, and they said performing in the children's Christmas musical: *Dr. Newheart's Christmas Cure*. My associate pastor and I actually played the doctor and doctor's assistant in that production. It was so much fun!

We already have the children's choir in place at 11:30 a.m., but I would like to see this expanded. I would love to see our children present a faith-based musical twice a year in the Spring and in the Winter. If all goes well, perhaps we can do a summer musical (not necessarily faith-based) as a way of reaching out to our neighbors. I honestly believe programs like these attract young families.

What keeps us from building a program like this? Well, finances, leadership and a team. Programs like this cost money and this kind of a thing hasn't been in our budget in recent years. Regarding leadership, this kind of thing isn't really in Juliana's (Director of Children's Ministry) wheelhouse; and when I spoke to Sophia (Director of Children's Choir), she let me know she's got her hands full with her upcoming Master's Recital and Thesis. And, of course, one person cannot do this alone; it takes a team.

If you have ideas or want to help with our children's ministry, please talk to me! If you would like to take the lead on this ministry, please talk to me! If you know someone who might be a good fit for this role, please talk to me! We want to be a blessing to the children in our community and their families. And we pray for God's guidance.

A final comment. I know not everyone is excited about these changes. I ask that you not make a judgment before giving it a shot. And remember something that a good friend of mine used to say to me: "The great thing about change is that you can always change it back." Nothing is set in stone. The leaders of this church are simply seeking to follow God's leading and be sensitive to the new thing that God is trying to do here.

Please pray for us! Pray for your leaders. Pray for our congregation. Pray for our witness to our neighbors.

And I pray that each and every one of you has a most blessed New Year!

2025 Contribution Reminder

Just a reminder: to receive a tax credit for contributions made to the church for the calendar year 2025, donors must deliver or mail checks on or before December 31, 2025. Checks that are written, mailed, and postmarked in 2025 will be deductible for that year, even if they are not received by the church until 2026. **IMPORTANT:** To ensure the deductibility of your contributions, do not file your 2025 income tax return until you have received written acknowledgment of your contributions from the church. Some contributions may not be tax-deductible if you file your tax return before receiving this acknowledgment.

2026 Per Capita

Each year, our budget includes funds to cover our congregation's share of the administrative costs associated with being part of the Presbyterian Church (USA). This share is calculated based on total membership and is referred to as "Per Capita." This year, the Per Capita amount is \$14.41 per member. A blue Per Capita offering envelope is located in your box of offering envelopes. The Per Capita assessment covers the overhead costs of our Presbytery, Synod, and General Assembly. 
