FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Enlarge Our Territory

*"Oh, that You would bless me indeed, and enlarge my territory,
that Your hand would be with me, and that You would keep me from evil."*

1 Chronicles 4:9

In the year 2000, Bruce Wilkinson published a short, simple book titled, The Prayer of Jabez. The book was quite popular among Christians, selling over 2 million copies in the first year. Some have criticized it as promoting the "prosperity gospel," but I appreciate the idea that we should pray for God's blessing and the enlarging of our territories in a spiritual, Kingdom of God, sense. Building the Kingdom of God should be a priority for every local congregation.

One recent poll said 80% of church members believe the church exists to care for its members, the same poll said 80% of pastors believe the church exists to share the gospel and spread the good news. For this reason, there is often a disconnect between many pastors and church members. Personally, I think both are important, but if pushed, I would say the church's number one priority is to lead children, men and women to a saving faith in Jesus Christ.

For this reason, many new pastors come into an existing congregation with fresh eyes looking for ways to improve communication with, and outreach to, the community. I've been here for about 2 & ½ years now. In that time, many ideas and topics have come up. Your session is prayerfully considering these ideas to seek God's will for us as a church family. Some of these have to do with a new name for the church, a new mission statement, a new approach to Sunday mornings, and even a new worship leader.

Now, I know, many people will balk at the idea of a name change. Tom Leo told an interesting story to the session that I want to share. He and Suzie were married at The First Foursquare Church of Van Nuys. He said, "I'm guessing none of you know the church by that name; you probably know it by its current name: Church on the Way." In the early 70s, the church changed its name and its trajectory from a declining congregation to a growing one.

Now, let's be clear, changing a name is not a magic pill for growth. There needs to be a profound shift in culture. Prayer must be a priority, not an after-thought. Love must be genuine. Truth must be proclaimed. And holiness must be pursued. But think about it for a moment. If someone invited me to go to The First Foursquare Church of Van Nuys, I would hesitate; but if someone invited me to Church on the Way, I would be more interested. The point of a good name is that it invites rather than separates.

The session has voted to consider new names for the church. If you have any ideas for a name, please send it to me. We're compiling a list. Think about a name that would identify who we are, would be attractive to the unchurched, and would not be stuck in one decade (like moss green appliances in the 70s).

Please note, we are not leaving the PCUSA. In fact, the name change will be a DBA (Doing Business As). All our legal documents will continue as the First Presbyterian Church of Granada Hills. If someone does an internet search for Presbyterian Churches in the area, we will come up. Our website will clearly show that we are part of the PCUSA.

The session also voted to adopt new Mission and Vision Statements. A Vision Statement speaks to a lofty goal of who we want to be, as if we are looking from a distance and saying, "That's where we want to end up!" The Mission Statement, on the other hand, identifies steps (or strategies) to reach that goal. Both statements should be easily transferable; in other words, they can be applied to both the congregation and the individual.

Much of the new Vision Statement is taken from the former Mission Statement. Here's the new Vision Statement:

*To be a light in the heart of San Fernando Valley.
To be a Christ-centered fellowship that seeks to glorify God.
To be a place of heart-felt worship, fellowship, and discipleship.
To be a congregation that reaches both inward to our membership
and outward to our community with the transforming power of God.
To be intentionally intercultural and intergenerational.*

And here's the new Mission Statement:

*To know Jesus and make Him known;
To love God and glorify Him;
To be filled with the Holy Spirit
so that we might love others as Christ loves us
and magnify God's presence in the world.*

Everything that we do here at FPCGH will run through the filter of this Mission Statement (including a new name). Are we achieving the goals that we feel God has set before us? Could we do things better? Perhaps more importantly, one of our elders mentioned that when he looked at church websites, he often looked for a Mission Statement to see if they aligned with his goals in ministry. So, expect to hear the new Mission Statement more often in worship.

The session also voted to approach Sunday mornings differently. What does that mean? Beginning December 28th (the Sunday after Christmas) we are moving to ONE SERVICE at 10:00 a.m. The details of this are still being worked out, but after much discussion and prayer, the session felt this was the best decision for the life of our church family. If you have questions or concerns, please don't hesitate to reach out to me or to one of the elders.

Finally, I'm thrilled to announce that Caleb Hulin has accepted the position as Contemporary Worship Leader for the church. Caleb is well-known to us. He is a gifted musician with a heart for the Lord. In conversation with him, he said his goal is to bring the congregation into the presence of the Lord. I love that! Not only is he well-known to us, he knows us pretty well, too. I know it's hard to worship when you're learning a new song, so expect to be singing songs that are more familiar to us.

I'm super excited for what God is doing here at First Pres. How will He enlarge our territories? How will we further His Kingdom here in the Valley? I pray He blesses us; He expands our territories; I pray His strong right hand guides us; and that He keeps us from all evil.

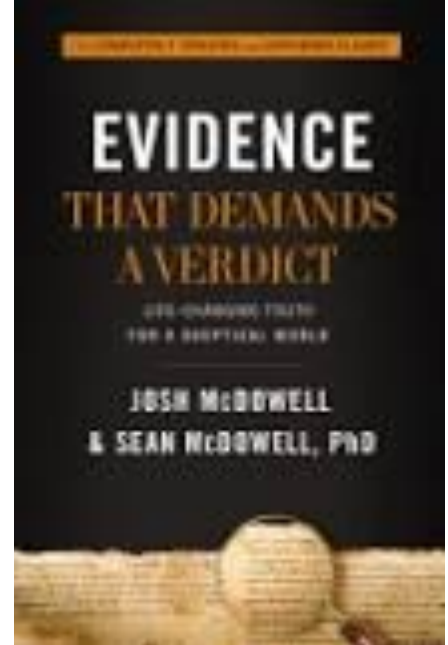
Sundays
