From the Pastor's Desk

"For God So Loved..."

"For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life." (John 3:16)

It is arguably the most beloved, most memorized verse in all of scripture: "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life." I'm guessing everyone who is reading this at this time knows this verse. Songs have been written using the text. Signs are held up in stadium endzones. Many people refer to John 3:16 as the "Gospel in a Nutshell."

I recently read John 3 in my own personal devotional time, and then I used it as inspiration for my Morning Coffee with Pastor Lance podcast on facebook. John tells the story of Nicodemus – one of the first-century Jewish religious leaders – who came to talk to Jesus at night. It's a conversation for the ages! Rich in historical, theological and doctrinal truths. I remember during one of my podcasts saying, "I should do a sermon series on John 3." Several people remarked that they thought that was a good idea.

So, here we are, in the season of Easter. Did you know Easter was a season in the liturgical calendar? The Sundays after Resurrection Sunday and before Pentecost are called the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, et al Sundays of Easter. So during this season of Easter, between Resurrection and Pentecost, we'll be looking at this chapter in a series titled, "Late Night Conversations."

What does it mean to be "Born Again"? How is the Spirit of God like the wind? What does the gospel have to do with the bronze serpent in the wilderness wanderings of the people of Israel? What does Jesus really say about condemnation? Given some of the most critical truths about what it means to be a Christian found in this chapter, this season is an excellent time to invite friends, family, neighbors to come to a Sunday worship service and checkout First Pres.

On another note, please pray for the staffing here at FPCGH. After the three-month probationary period, Helen Magaña stepped down as co-Director of Youth Ministry. So, Maggie Benjamin is currently flying solo. After Carol Morain retired, Juliana Price graciously stepped up to serve as Interim Director of Children's Ministry. We are posting for the Children's and Youth Director positions. If you know any good candidates, please send them our way! We want God's best for our children and students. And we pray God brings the right people to serve with us here in the heart of the Valley. Your prayers would be greatly appreciated!


Overall, it's been a wonderful time to be a part of the Music Ministry at FPCGH. I hope you'll join us as we move forward!

Welcoming Our New Organist



Kyung Hee was born in Seoul, South Korea. Even before she was a year old, she wouldn't be able to sleep if her mother did not sing a lullaby, and Kyung Hee started learning piano in a young age. She started nurturing her musical talent starting in third grade of elementary school, singing at school showtimes and youth ministries in her church. She became an accompanist for her church since she was in fifth grade, and stayed active playing for kindergarten ministry, youth choir, and college contemporary praise team as a keyboardist. For the next 27 years, she was an organist of some Korean Presbyterian's churches in Seoul. Also she would teach organ in Presbyterian University and Theological Seminary for 13 years, then serve as a chapel organist in that same university. Currently, she is serving in FPCGH as an organist.

Kyung Hee studied church music, organ, piano, and composition in Presbyterian University and Theological Seminary for both her undergraduate and graduate degrees, studied in multiple named organ music academies in Europe such as North German Organ Academy, Romemutier Academy in Swiss, and International Haarlem Organ Festival in Nederland during her summer. She has also studied in USC for her Early Music Graduate Certificate, as an organ and harpsichord major.

She studied organ since her first year of university and developed a deep interest in the music of J.S. Bach, making Bach her inspiration. She has been striving to connect the profound spirituality she derives from the music and life of Bach expressed through his works. To work towards the presence of God through church music, she is currently studying M.Div at Grace Mission University, and is living a journey filled with praising God with her husband and three sons.

From Tom Shedd





2024 Per Capita


